MOVIN'OUT

Movin' Out provides a range of housing solutions to adults with disabilities and to families that include children with disabilities.

They assist people who have permanent developmental, physical, sensory, medical or mental health disabilities, or a combination of impairments, that make them eligible for long term care services.

Housing counselors manage information and can provide referrals to resources covering a wide range of housing issues including home ownership, home owner rehab, rental, fair housing, and accessibility.

They also offer an option to families engaged in estate planning, particularly families that include aging parents and adult sons and daughters with disabilities. A family can transfer ownership of their home to Movin' Out to insure that the family member with a disability can stay in the familiar family home for a lifetime, even after the parents pass away.
