GET INVOLVED WITH PARTNERS!

Wisconsin Partners in Policymaking is a six-session advocacy and systems change training program designed to develop a group of future leaders across the state, who are able to work with legislators and communities on policies and initiatives that will support the full participation and inclusion of people with developmental disabilities in all aspects of life.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Partners in Policymaking is designed for adults with developmental disabilities and family members of children and youth with developmental disabilities ages birth to 21.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF PARTICIPANTS?

Partners are expected to make a commitment to: Attendance at all regular sessions is required, from Friday at 1 p.m. to Saturday at 4 p.m. Only individuals selected to participate in the program will be able to attend (with supports as needed). Aside from attendant care, additional family members do not attend sessions and should not plan on staying at the hotel with participants. Develop and implement a project that results in systems change that will improve the lives of people with disabilities and their families. The 2017-18 session dates are Oct. 27&28, 2017, Dec 1 & 2, 2017, Jan 26 & 27, 2018, Mar 2 & 3, 2018, Apr 6 & 7, 2018, May 11th & 12th, 2018
