No past work experience? No problem!

If you are over 18 years old and looking for a job that doesn't require past job experience, it can be tricky to find employment.

A good starting place would be to look at food service and hotel jobs. Companies like Culvers and McDonalds are willing to hire people without experience. They are also great places to work that teach customer



Finding a job while in high school

If you are under 18 years old, it can be difficult to find a job that will hire teenagers. We took a look at the most common jobs for teenagers. Food service jobs are popular for high school students. Companies like McDonalds and Noodles & Company hire people at age 16 or older.

Babysitting is a great job for teenagers, but it's important to understand how to take care of infants and young children. The American Red Cross offers courses on Babysitting Basics, First Aid, and CPR. To see the classes offered, click here.

It's important to understand the laws that protect minors in the workplace. Teenagers between the ages of 12-15 are required to have a work permit before they start working. There are some exceptions to needing a work permit, like volunteering or babysitting. Minors cannot work more than 6 consecutive hours without a 30-minute meal break. For anyone looking to get experience and build skills before finding a job, volunteering is a great option. As a volunteer, you are able to get experience working with others, build skills, and give back to the community. United Way of Greater Milwaukee and Waukesha County has a volunteer portal to help people find opportunities in the area.

Some current volunteer options are reading to young children at Next Door's Books for Kids program, helping collect garbage and do landscaping tasks at St. Joseph Academy, and assisting residents with music groups and arts and crafts at VMP Manor Park.

Computer Skills

In the newsletter last month, we talked about where you can go to use a computer in Milwaukee County, if you don't have one at home. There are also resources in the county for learning how to use computers and strengthen your technology knowledge.

Milwaukee Public Library offers different computer classes every week. Some classes include Tech-splanation, Career Navigation Job Help, and Back to Business in the Business Commons – Microsoft Work and Excel.

Employ Milwaukee has four week course on Digital Literacy. The course is offered to Milwaukee residents at no cost, but it must be attended in person at 2341 N. 27th Street. Topics covered are exploring the Internet, learning how to use Email, and using Microsoft Office apps.
